In case of Drop-out from the Credit Suisse Grand-Prix, replacements will be taken from the best Rolex Ranked Athlete either from the 8 Swiss Wild Cards or the 8 additional Athletes.

Western European countries with at least 3.5 million inhabitants, but not organising a Rolex FEI World Cup™ competition, may send one rider to each Rolex FEI World Cup™ event, provided that at least one rider from the country is in the top 60 on the Rolex Ranking list, or 2 in the top 200.

Article 654.1.1.4

The three NF's with the most points obtained by having athletes placed 11 to 60 on the Rolex Ranking list may send a second athlete to each event in Western Europe. The following scale of points applies:

- a rider placed 11 to 25 = 2 points
- a rider placed 26 to 60 = 1 point

These riders only have the automatic right to compete in the Rolex FEI World Cup™ competitions in the first half of the season if there are 40 or less athletes invited to the event or participation in the Rolex FEI World Cup™ competition.

The Organising Committee has 8 Wild Cards to invite additional athletes. These athletes only have the automatic right to compete in the Rolex FEI World Cup™ competition if there are 40 or less riders invited to the event.

NB: (The FEI Wild Card athlete is included within the 8 Organising Committee's Wild Cards if there is no qualifying competition for the Rolex FEI World Cup™ competition).

Jumping : General Regulations 'Youngster Tour'

The 'Youngster Tour' (obstacle height 125 cm to 135 cm max, 6 and 7 year-old horses) is by invitation. Only the best 50 Athletes of the Rolex Rankings as of November 1, 2011 and Athletes selected for the CHI-W 2011 of Geneva riding a CH horse (born and raised in Switzerland), are automatically authorised to enter these classes. Other competitors will

need the Organising Committee's **written** approval, but in principle, it is impossible.

Jumping: General Regulations "Suisse Romande Wild Card" and "Best under 25" (approx. 9 riders in total)

Swiss riders having received a "Suisse Romande Wild Card" or the "Best under 25" have a separate set of regulations. Horses' health requirements must nevertheless be fulfilled.

The riders having received a "Suisse Romande Wild Card" or "Best under 25" and their groom will receive neither daily nor transport compensation.

The riders participating to the CSI-W/CAI-W thanks to a "Suisse Romande Wild Card" or the "Best Under 25" will not pay entry fees, but their stable box will cost CHF 75 per night, (litter, wood shavings and food in addition will be at the rider's charge).

If these riders decide to have a hotel room, it will be at their own cost.

The "Suisse Romande Wild Card" riders and the "Best under 25" can enter in 4 or 5* classes of their choice (*Relay, class Nr 19 does not count). Entry to class numbers 10 (CS GP), and 22 (WC Rolex FEI) is in principle forbidden. In accordance with the Swiss "chef d'équipe" and the organisers, a further horse can participate (Small Tour) in max. 4 classes (Relay, class Nr 19 does not count). The Swiss "Chef d'équipe" and the CHI-W Organising Committee will decide if the second horse meets the requirements.

It is no longer possible to for those riders to ride in the Jockey-Club classes.

NB: If any rider withdraws after the date of definite entries without a valid excuse (example: illness or lameness), the competitor will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss suffered by the OC (i.e. limited to stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal.

DRIVING

Open to 5 drivers of the Top Ten Drivers 2011. *Wild Cards may be allocated upon request from the Organising Committee. One Wild card is allocated by the OC of the country in which the event is held, in agreement with the NF. This Wild card is reserved for a Home Driver. A second Wild Card may be allocated by the OC in conjunction with the FEI. All Drivers who may be invited to compete as a Wild Card entry must have competed at least once in the applicable summer qualifying events.*

Any Driver who competes in a FEI World Cup™ as a Wild Card entry cannot earn FEI World Cup™ points from his result from that event.

The two wild cards may be allocated to: a Swiss and/or a French driver

Per team: 3 athletes and 1 groom

Horses: Each driver may enter 5 horses.

ENTRIES VIA THE HippoBase ONLINE ENTRY SYSTEM

All entries have obligatorily to be made via the HippoBase online entry system (<http://login/hippobase.com>). NFs who need assistance on this or do not yet have a login for the system may contact: support@hippobase.com.

Entry forms **must include** the following information on **horses/ponies**: name of horse/pony, date of birth, breed, country of birth, studbook initials, passport number, color, sex, name(s) of owner(s).

Companions like grooms or horse owners who wish to access the venue must be added to the online entry system under the respective rider and we kindly ask you to assign a picture to those people so accreditation passes can be prepared.

Any requests for **hotel reservations** have to be specified with the room type (single/double) and the date of arrival and departure directly in the online entry system with copy to: fguanter@chi-geneve.ch. If you do not need a room for someone please specify "none" as room type to clarify this.

The OC will **not accept** any other entries or incomplete entries.

Any extra horse must be announced well in advance and a fee of CHF 75.- per horse/per day will be charged.

2. GROOMS

Requests for accommodation must be sent with entries.

Cost of accommodation will be at the cost of OC Athletes from 07/12/11 to 11/12/11.

Meals: at OC Athletes expense from 07/12/11 to 11/12/11 (Stables restaurant).

The show jumping grooms (maximum one per competitor), will receive a compensation of CHF 40.- per day, from Wednesday 7th December, 2011 to Sunday 11th December, 2011 (five days). The driving team grooms will receive the same as from Friday 9th December, 2011 (maximum one per driver, three days). This does not concern the grooms of the "Suisse Romande Wild Card" Athletes.

The OC provides sufficient sanitary and showering facilities on site, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms.

3. HORSES / PONIES

Transport expenses to be paid by:

Jumping:

The Committee meets transport expenses for the jumping riders as follows:

Foreign competitors: CHF 500.-- for three or four horses,
CHF 350.-- for two horses and,
CHF 200.-- for one horse

Competitors residing in Switzerland: no transport or travel compensation.

Driving:

The Committee assumes transport compensation for the drivers as follows:

For the driving teams CAI-W: CHF 3.-- per km, per team, "one way only" (max CHF 3'000.-)*

The Committee shall not bear any additional costs resulting from a dispatch, which does not conform to these instructions.

The Committee shall not take out any insurance for the transport of the horses and persons accompanying them, its liability shall not, in any event, exceed that of the transport contractor being used. If, in case of accident, illness of an animal or bad road conditions, the Committee is called upon to hire transport at the request of and on behalf of the competitors, it shall in no case assume liability in case of accident, and this without recourse either against the transporter himself or the Committee; the handling of loading and unloading, moreover, devolves upon the grooms themselves and involves their own responsibility.

For the jumping horses, stabling arrangements from Tuesday, December 6 to Sunday December 11, 2011 to be paid by OC.

Driving:

For driving horses, from Friday December 9, 2011, as of 12:30 to Sunday December 11, 2011 to be paid by OC.

The international horses will be stabled in boxes at 'Palexpo' in a hall adjoining the show arena which will be strictly controlled and to which access will be restricted in accordance with the security Veterinary Regulations (Art. 1005). Wood shavings and hay will be sold at cost price. Straw will be provided free of charge for those who want it.

In the event of a tie, the points are shared between competitors. If there is a tie in the final placing, the Grand Prix Rolex – Rolex FEI World Cup™ will be decisive

Prizes will be awarded by their donors on Sunday at around 16:45-17:00, after the Grand Prix Rolex – Rolex FEI World Cup™. **The presence of the winning riders is compulsory.**

Should a dispute arise, the Ground Jury represented by Mrs Catherine de Coulon and Mr Cesare Croce and the Organising Committee of the CSI-W/CAI-W represented by Mrs Sophie Mottu Morel and Mr Alban Poudret, are authorized to decide.

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The distribution of prizes, will take place at the end of every Competition. The riders and the drivers are kindly requested to follow and respect the instructions given by the OC. The first six (6) riders are requested to be present except for the Credit Suisse Grand Prix, the Champions' Challenge® and Grand Prix Rolex FEI World Cup™ where the first eight (8) will be asked to be present.

4. PAYMENT AND DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

The distribution of the sum allotted to each class shall be fixed according to the importance of the class and the number of competitors in such a way as to reward at least one out of five competitors. If several horses are equally placed, the cash prizes due to them shall be added together. The sum of this total shall be distributed in equal parts to the horses equally placed. Payment of the riders' winnings will be made by the Treasurer, 'Finances Sportives', 30 minutes after the end of class Nr 22 for the classes Nr 2,3,4,5,8,9,10,13,14, 15,17,18,19,20 and 22. Drivers' winnings (classes 11, 16, 21 will receive their prizes at the end of class Nr 21.

All payments (cash prizes, registration, travelling expenses, deposits, etc) will be made in Swiss francs (CHF).

Deductions:

I: TAX AT SOURCE

We inform you that in a letter dated March 28th 1996, the Canton of Geneva stated its intention to apply the Federal Law regarding direct taxation and the Law of taxation at source. These legal provisions concern **all competitors in the CHI-W (riders and drivers) who do not have a Swiss residence permit**. This means that on net winnings, after deduction of living expenses indicated on the final statement of account at the end of the competition, **a tax rate of 0 to 25% will be applied**, according to the total balance. Our Sports Financial Service (*Finances Sportives*) can provide additional information on this matter.

An official declaration detailing the fiscal deduction will be given to each competitor concerned, together with his/her final statement. It will facilitate the recovery of this tax in his/her country of residence.

II: SOCIAL INSURANCE

The activity of riders and drivers is considered as an independent activity by the Federal Insurance Office. As a consequence all earnings must be included and declared by all competitors in their independent revenue both in Switzerland and abroad.

A: SWISS COMPETITORS

All Athletes living in Switzerland, are requested to hand in a proof of their affiliation as an independent to an official compensation office of the OASI (Old Age and Survivors Insurance-AVS/AHV).

In case you do not provide this document, the earnings of "Prize Money" exceeding the amount of CHF 2,200.- will be subject to contribution of the OASI (AVS/AHV).

The CHI-W cannot bear the cost of the employers part, the applicable rate will be 13.61 (example: if the prize money is CHF 10,000, an amount of CHF 1,361 will be deducted and a net amount of CHF 8,639 will be paid out to the competitor).

B: FOREIGN ATHLETES

For riders coming from a country which is part of the European Union (EU) or a country from the European Free Trade Association (EFTA), we kindly ask you to hand in the E 101 formula, which proves that you are subject to a social security system as an independent in your country.

In case of not handing in the documents, **we remind you** that the possible earnings of "Prize Money" must be considered as an income of an independent activity and that it is your responsibility to declare this as such in your country.

We draw your attention to the fact that the Swiss OASI could perform controls in your country.

C. OTHER FOREIGN ATHLETES

We remind you that the possible earnings of "Prize Money" must be considered as an income of an independent activity and that it is your responsibility to declare this as such in your country.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The Committee assumes no responsibility for accidents or illness that might occur affecting the owners, riders, driving teams, grooms or horses, nor for thefts, fires or any other damages

4. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Please note the conditions to be met and the documents to be completed prior to importing horses into Switzerland for the period of the competitions.

Entry into Switzerland:

From France and other European Community countries (EC)

- ATA Carnet **mandatory**
- Health certificate: Document TRACES or APPENDIX "B" of the Directive 90/426/ CEE

These three documents must be presented at the Swiss Customs' Office upon entry.

NB: for the temporary import of horses only occasionally crossing borders (Attractions, etc.) our Customs Agent can obtain – for the period of the horse show only – a customs permit, in lieu of the ATA Carnet, at a significantly reduced cost. Should you be interested in this solution, please contact Mr. André Barthassat at FERT & Co. Tel. +41 79 659 80 54 or a.barthassat@fert.ch, by **November 16, 2011 at the latest**. Establishment and discharge of a customs permit: CHF 350.- per case, per competitor.

From other countries (outside the EC)

- FEI Passport
- ATA Carnet **mandatory**
- Health certificate (form 95/23)

These three documents must be presented at the Swiss Customs' Office upon entry.

NO veterinary inspection at the border for horses with an ATA Carnet.

When filling in the ATA document (provided by the Chamber of Commerce), do not forget to mention details of equipment accompanying the horses.

Customs papers, ATA Carnet and customs permit must be presented at the veterinary inspection.

In case of problems with pre-issued ATA Carnets which need to be amended, the official customs agent FERT & Cie will charge CHF 50.- for entry into Switzerland and CHF 50.- for return into the EC. This fee is to be paid directly to FERT & Cie, through the *Finances Sportives* of the CHI-W.

Please remember that horses arriving with ATA Carnets must be presented to the French customs and then at the Swiss border to the FERT & Cie's, Mr André Barthassat (Tel. +41(0)79 659 80 54).

Departure from Switzerland:

The same documents must be presented at the Swiss Customs' Office when horses leave the country. The re-exportation should take place no later than 7 days after the end of the event.

In principle, there is no veterinary inspection at the border when entering the European Community (EC).

The CHI-W veterinarian will provide a health certificate at the end of the event.

Upon their arrival, each participant or their representative will immediately provide all details concerning their departure.

All documents needed for entering Switzerland (ATA Carnet, customs permit, passports, health certificates) are to be handed over to the Veterinarian Commission when the horses are unloaded.

Return and departure of horses at the close of the CHI-W

Upon arrival, the competitors will be contacted by the representative of the Transport Commission, who will ask for their instructions. No changes can be made to the departure arrangements after 10 a.m. on Friday December 9, 2011 for riders and respectively 3 pm for the drivers.

Should a change be really necessary, the Secretariat must be informed immediately (in writing) – to the attention of the Transport Commission – with no guarantee that the change will be successful. Extra costs are to be borne by the originator of the request.

The time schedules for collecting the equipment from the stables and the departure of the horses will be indicated on the evening preceding departure. Their departure should take place **at the latest Monday, the 12th December, 2011, 8 am.**

The Committee reserves the right to refuse payment of any additional costs or consequences that could arise due to late information (later than **Friday, December 9, 2011 at 10:00 am for riders, respectively 3 pm for the drivers**) of changes in departure plans.

The OC is informing you that you will have to foresee fees for the customs agent (FERT) in case of problems with the ATA documents, cost of departure formalities and other problems. For example customs permits (non-valid ATA Carnets).

In accordance with French Law, Trucks weighing more than 7 tons are not allowed to travel on Sunday, December 11, 2011. Drivers who intend to do so should obtain a special authorization (issued by *préfectures départementales*). This should be applied for prior to arrival in Switzerland, otherwise departure must take place on Monday morning.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
